The next meeting of the AAUW Book Club is the third Friday, February 17, at the Palm Springs Library from 2 to 4 pm. Amy Schwed will moderate the discussion of **Small Great Things** by Jodi Picoult.



Ruth Jefferson is a labor and delivery nurse at a Connecticut hospital with more than twenty years' experience. During her shift, Ruth begins a routine checkup on a newborn, only to be told a few minutes later that she's been reassigned to another patient. The parents are white supremacists and don't want Ruth, who is African American, to touch their child. The hospital complies with their request, but the next day, the baby goes into cardiac distress while Ruth is alone in the nursery. Does she obey orders or does she intervene?

Ruth hesitates before performing CPR and, as a result, is charged with a serious crime. Kennedy McQuarrie, a white public defender, takes her case but gives unexpected advice: Kennedy insists that mentioning race in the courtroom is not a winning strategy. Conflicted by Kennedy's counsel, Ruth tries to keep life as normal as possible for her family—especially her teenage son—as the case becomes a media sensation. As the trial moves forward, Ruth and Kennedy must gain each other's trust, and come to see that what they've been taught their whole lives about others—and themselves—might be wrong.

With incredible empathy, intelligence, and candor, Jodi Picoult tackles race, privilege, prejudice, justice, and compassion—and doesn't offer easy answers. Small Great Things is a remarkable achievement from a writer at the top of her game. -- Goodreads

### Bylaw Amendments to be Voted on at Annual Meeting

The Amendments change the number of mandatory meetings from seven to five and the annual meeting date from the month of April to the Spring. These changes give more flexibility to the branch.

ARTICLE XI. BRANCH MEETINGS

Branch Meetings. There shall be at least seven (7) five (5) meetings of Branch members each year.

Annual Meeting. An annual meeting of the Branch shall be held during the month of April <u>Spring</u>, the exact time and place determined by the board. The annual meeting shall elect officers, fix dues, amend bylaws if necessary, receive reports of officers, committees and task forces, and conduct such other business as may properly arise.

Quorum. Fifteen percent (15%) of the members of the Branch shall constitute a quorum.
