Educational and Legal News from AAUW National Compiled by Betty Rigdon

AAUW is calling on lawmakers to help with student debt crisis

Women hold nearly 2/3 (\$929 billion) of country's \$1.46 trillion student debt Ways to address debt include:

safeguard and expand Pell Grants and other aid

support efforts toward tuition and debt-free options

help students' academic and financial needs, one example would be affordable child care

narrow pay gap

<u>Federal District Court judge in D.C.</u> ruled that government acted illegally when it stopped Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) from collecting pay data by gender, race and ethnicity from employers with 100+ employees

Judge ruled that these employers must submit 2 years' worth of such data by 9/30/19

U.S. Dept. of Justice has appealed

Case now before D.C. Circuit Court of Appeals

<u>AAUW signs onto Amicus Brief in case</u> to support contraceptive coverage State of California, et.al v. Health and Human Services, et. al is currently in US District Court for Northern District of California

Case calls for summary judgment to permanently invalidate the Final Exemption Rules that allow organizations with religious or moral objections to be exempt from the contraceptive mandate in Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act AAUW has signed onto several Amicus Briefs challenging rollbacks of ACA's contraceptive coverage

These cases are at the district and appellate court levels

In Pennsylvania v. President of the United States, et. al - Pennsylvania filed a civil action in the US District Court for the Eastern District of Pennsylvania

Pennsylvania stated that interim rules violated several constitutional guarantees Court granted preliminary injunction and federal government appealed

In January a federal judge issued a preliminary injunction blocking contraceptive rules from taking effect nationwide- once again the government appealed to Third Circuit

AAUW and other amici organizations are now trying to persuade Third Circuit to uphold nationwide preliminary injunction

AAUW signs onto Amicus Brief in case to appeal narrow view of Title IX

Jane Doe v. University of Kentucky involves "Doe" who was sexually assaulted while enrolled in a dual enrollment partnership between Bluegrass Community and Technical College and U. of KY

She sued U of KY to carry out its Title IX responsibilities

Court ruled that she didn't have standing with U of KY even though she was raped in university-owned dorm where she lived

Case appealed to US Court of Appeals for the Sixth Circuit as it was felt that the previous court had a too narrow reading of Title IX

AAUW Legal Advocacy Fund has updated 2 resources- "Know Your Rights at Work" and "Know Your Rights on Campus"
