Who Is: Naseem Ahmed?

Naseem was born in Bangladesh, and spent time in Malaysia and Libya where her father was a diplomat. In 1975 Naseem came to the U.S. in pursuit of her higher education after completing her undergraduate degree in Political Science from Dhaka University, Bangladesh. She is a first generation immigrant and a proud citizen of the USA, her adopted country. Naseem received her MPA from the University of Pittsburgh where she did her post-graduate studies. Her career in international education included 23 years at Southern Illinois University where she taught public policy and gender studies, administered overseas grants and projects, plus being the Coordinator of Women and International Development. An AAUW member for over 30 years, Naseem has served as International Chair at branch, state, and national boards.

Currently Naseem had founded and is executive director of a charitable foundation that supports women's education in the medical and technical fields. Additionally Naseem's foundation is developing holistic living environments for the elderly in Bangladesh.

BOOK CLUB NEWS

On Friday, February 15, the AAUW Book Club will discuss *In the Midst of Winter* by Isabel Allende led by Virginia. It will take place at the Palm Springs Library at 2:00 PM.

According to Goodreads: **In the Midst of Winter** begins with a minor traffic accident which becomes the catalyst for an unexpected and moving love story between two people who thought they were deep into the winter of their lives. Richard Bowmaster—a 60-year-old human rights scholar—hits the car of Evelyn Ortega—a young, undocumented immigrant from Guatemala—in the middle of a snowstorm in Brooklyn. What at first seems just a small inconvenience takes an unforeseen and far more serious turn when Evelyn turns up at the professor's house seeking help. At a loss, the professor asks his tenant Lucia Maraz—a 62-year-old lecturer from Chile—for her advice. These three very different people are brought together in a mesmerizing story that moves from present-day Brooklyn to Guatemala in the recent past to 1970s Chile and Brazil, sparking the beginning of a long overdue love story between Richard and Lucia.

Exploring the timely issues of human rights and the plight of immigrants and refugees, the book recalls Allende's landmark novel The House of the Spirits in the way it embraces the cause of "humanity, and it does so with passion, humor, and wisdom that transcend politics" (Jonathan Yardley, The Washington Post). In the Midst of Winter will stay with you long after you turn the final page.

In U.S. court of Appeals for the Second Circuit

Case seeks to clarify Rule 23 class certification standards

Courts have been weakening class certification standards which then limits women's ability to pursue joint action that challenges systematic discrimination

In this case the 9 plaintiffs are bringing a sex discrimination class action on behalf of 10,000 female KMPG employees nation-wide

Ask your congressional member to co-sponsor and pass the Paycheck Fairness Act It will be introduced in Congress soon

Women's Economic Security Conference Call

AAUW-FL Women's Income Security for Hispanics (WISH) Research Project

Mary Gatta, Ph.D. & her colleague, Jessica Honing, will provide a brief overview and update on AAUW-FL Women's Income Security for Hispanics (WISH) Research Project, which investigates the experiences of Hispanic women across the life span. The WISH project was launched as a result of findings from Dr. Gatta's 2018 report "Women, Economic Insecurity and Aging in the Florida Sunshine" in which Hispanic older women in Florida face significant economic security gaps relative to other groups. Although Equal Pay for Latina women is not until November 20, 2019, AAUW-FL can, with the final report, shine the light on this important injustice for Florida women.
